### Agenda

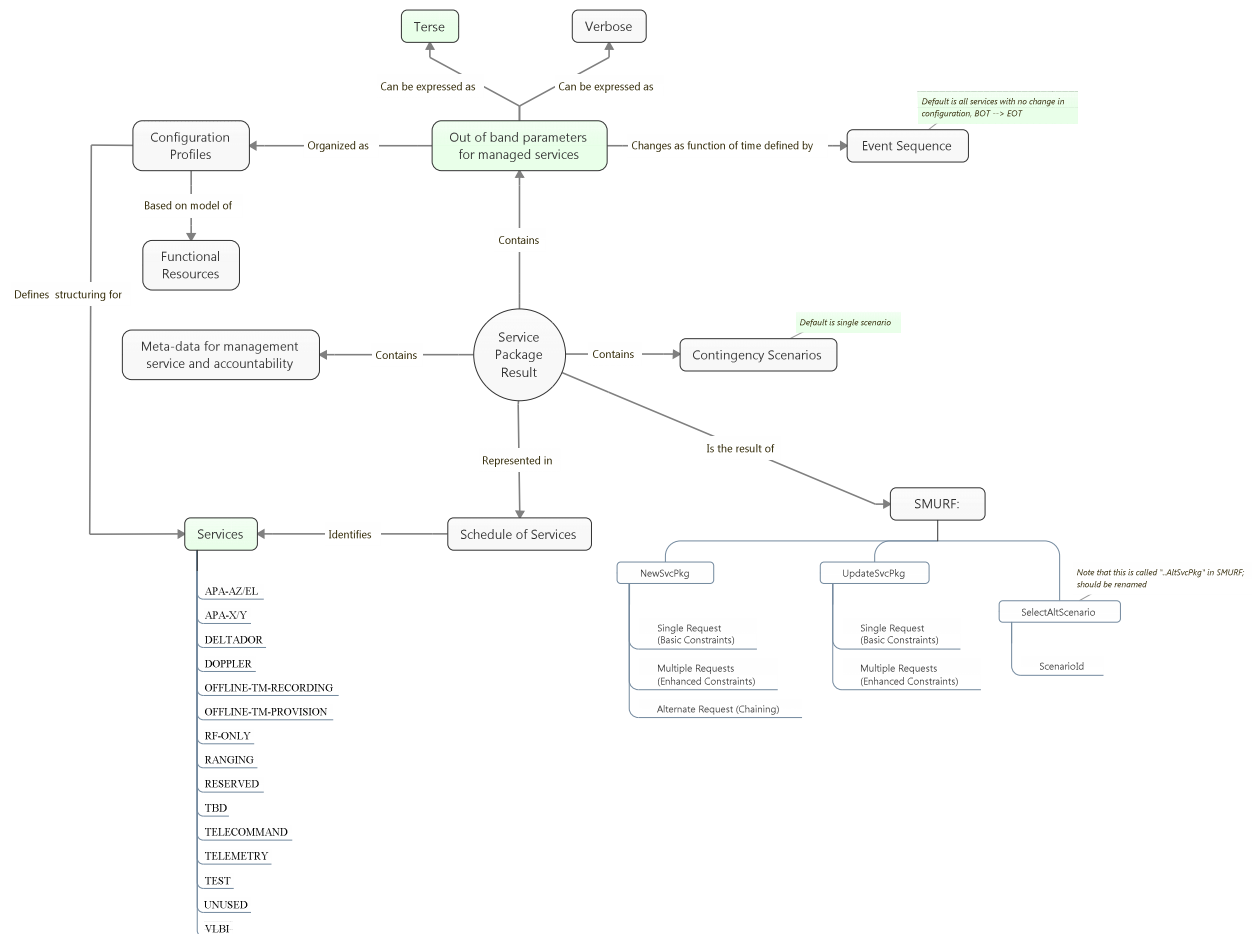
- 1) General updates/announcements
  - a. CSTS SFW
    - i. FYI, CSTS SFW should be very near to starting CESG polling
  - b. Control “Architecture” Need
    - i. Several different (potential) standards/mechanisms that need to be considered/coordinated
      1. SLE Throw event
      2. FF-CSTS Throw Event
      3. SC-CSTS
      4. ES-CSSM (event sequence)
      5. Select Alternate scenario (in current draft SMURF)
    - ii. Likely to be an area level topic at Rome meetings
- 2) Action items status – deferred until next telecon
- 3) Input re SOS from DSN/ESTRACK Schedule Exchange Engineering
  - a. Looked at different options for agency specific extensions vs current SOS book approach
  - b. Agreed to go with approach that requires agency specific extensions to be done so via agency specific schema
    - i. Declared with a namespace unique for the agency
    - ii. Agency specific schemas can be registered – should facility interoperability while also allowing agency to tailor the SOS for their needs
  - c. Given updated approach, there is no longer a need for allowing “nested” additional (extension) parameters
  - d. C. Haddow has produced updated class diagrams factoring in changes from this effort
    - i. Action to E. Barkley to send out before/after class diagrams
  - e. Noted that although the namespaces are good for sorting out the different agency specific extensions, also noted that we do not a proliferations of namespaces
    - i. E.g., Do we really need the common service management header to be in its own namespace (as it is currently)
      1. Preliminary consensus is that this can be consolidated a more general service management namespace
- 4) Follow-up from Service Package Splinter session
  - a. Essential idea at splinter session was how to lesson/eliminate to the extent possible dependency such that service package does not require dependency on other recommendations such as CP/SA to advance
    - i. This also applies to Event Sequence
  - b. Walked through updated
  - c. diagram outlining what the “simple” service package could look like (at a conceptual level). See diagram below.
